Annual SSIA Meeting:

The Annual Meeting is scheduled to be
held on 4 June 2022 at 0900 hours.
The meeting will be held at the
Association President's home, Mike
O'Brien, 29 Nancy Drive. We have
some lawn chairs, but bring your own
lawn chair. We hope that all members
of the association are able to
attend. This is also a great
opportunity for new members to meet
their neighbors. Coffee and dessert
will be available.

Election of Officers: The election of
officers will occur at our annual
meeting. All members in good
standing are eligible to vote or run
for office.

A copy of the SSIA job descriptions,
newsletters, bylaws and dock rules
are available on our website.

We are a volunteer organization. We
maintain the property of the Sunray
Shores Water District and the
association docks. One of our goals
of the SSIA is to make the area a
better place to live and vacation.
If you have any ideas on what you
would like to see accomplished or
improved, please attend our annual
meeting and get involved. Help
maintain the beauty and charm of our
neighborhood. Yard, fences, homes
and shore front should be maintained

at all times. Your yard should not look like a **junk yard!!** Repairs should be handled promptly. Ask your neighbors for recommendation on local service providers.

Our facilities are for members in good standing, and their guests. We identify good standing members as residents whose dues are paid in full and up to date, who comply with our bylaws and the Town of Belmont ordinances. Help us keep non-residents off the property. Our liability insurance extends only to members and allowed guests.

Marina Docks: The docks are for land locked owner's registered boat only! If you want a dock for the summer, send an E-Mail request to the Dock Master. Docks will be assigned on a first come basis. A copy of your boat registration, dock fee and association dues must be received by 1 July 2022. **Your boat must be tied up to the dock by 1 July or you lose the dock.** For land locked homes: If you sell your house, **REMIND** your realtor that a dock does **NOT** come with the house. Docks are limited and are rented on a first come basis.

Milfoil: Last year, divers were in the area and hand pulled only a small amount of milfoil. They are scheduled to be working on Lake Winnisquam again this summer. Hopefully, they will locate only a small amount of milfoil. We will keep the membership informed of the diver's schedule. If you see milfoil or other questionable aquatic plants, notify the milfoil committee.

Boat Launch: The boat ramp is for owners and their guests. In compliance with NH State Law, before you launch a boat or jet ski, inspect the water craft for any aquatic plants. Also, ensure that any bait tank or cooler has been drained and dried. There are invasive species in the area that are much worse than milfoil. It is up to us to work on

keeping these invasive species out of beautiful Winnisquam Lake.

Water: Our water system is maintained by the Sunray Shores Water District. If you see a water leak or would like information about the water district, please contact David Reinauer, 603-320-7445

Sewer: The sewer system is maintained by the Town of Belmont. Contact the Town of Belmont if you have a sewer problem or would like information, 603-267-8312

Beavers: We have a continuing problem with beavers in our area. They have constructed a good size beaver lodge in the grass between 102 Elaine Drive, Steve & Ann Senick, and 94 Elaine Drive, Joseph & Debra Santos. We have already trapped one beaver this year. If you see any beaver or freshly cut trees, notify Rod Glass, 603-738-5646, or Ed Stephenson, 603-897-9707, and we will contact the trapper.

Beach: A reminder, dogs are not allowed on the beach between 0800 and 1900 hours daily. As long as there are no one on the beach, dogs will be allowed before 0800; and after 1900 in the evening.

Golf Carts: Are not allowed on the beach at any time. They can drop people off at the gate and then park in the parking lot.

New Hampshire State Laws:

It is illegal to feed the wildlife!

Burn permits must be obtained from the Belmont Fire Station!

Town of Belmont Ordinances:

Speeding: Please obey the speed limit signs. We have lots of children and parents that walk, run, bike and play on our streets. So please **SLOW DOWN** when passing children and your neighbors as they enjoy our outstanding neighborhood.

Pets; Dogs must be registered. Must be on a leash. You must pick up your pet's wastes.

Noise: Quiet time is between 10pm and 7am, Monday to Saturday; and 10pm to 10am on Sunday. This applies to construction equipment, tools, vehicles, cannons, fireworks or any device with a volume that is audible at the property line or 50ft from a vehicle.

Fireworks: Any property owner seeking to display or possess Class C (common fireworks) shall obtain a written Class C Fireworks Permit from the Belmont Fire Chief.

HAZMAT: Currently, the Belknap County hazmat turn-in is scheduled for 30 July at the Belmont Fire Station and 6 August at the Laconia DPW Building. See; <https://www.lakesrpc.org/serviceshhw.asp> for turn-in instructions.

Phosphorous: Please do not use any fertilizer containing phosphorous, it is detrimental to the lake.
