RENTERS AND GUESTS Welcome to Sunray Shores

- The beach in maintained for the use of our Association members. It is <u>NOT</u> a public beach. If there are people present who are rowdy or disturbing your relaxation, please ask them to respect others or return to their cottages. Your assistance keeping the picnic tables on the grass area, picking up toys, chairs, trash and cigarette butts. Filling in holes on the beach will make it easier for us to keep the beach nice for your enjoyment.
- You can either take all your trash with you as you leave the beach or deposit it in the appropriate trash barrel provided for you. The Town of Belmont has specific recycling requirements. Please only put recycled items in the proper barrel (BLUE TOP).
- The area around the beach, channel and ponds, is a <u>NO WAKE ZONE</u>. This
 means high speeds are not tolerated and the Marine Patrol will issue tickets.
 They will be more present. The law affects all boat and jet ski operators that
 require a license.
- Discharging fireworks are <u>NOT</u> allowed on the beach. Fireworks can only be discharged on the property they are are renting. A permit is also needed and is issued by the Town of Belmont Fire Department. Please see this information on the Town's website or on the Sunrayshores.org website under the Documents section.
- As a reminder, not all homes are vacation destination. Many of our members live in the area year round and work either during the week, on weekends, or both.
 We respectfully request your consideration with loud music especially at night.
- The town of Belmont has a leash law. For the comfort of our residents and guests, we ask that you abide by this law as well as clean up after your pets.
- Millfoil and other invasive species is a big problem in our area. We ask that you
 do <u>NOT</u> add to the problem by bringing foreign matter when launching your boat.
 Please inspect your boat and remove any suspicious plant material.

- It is illegal to feed the ducks and geese. They must be able to fend for themselves or they will not survive our changing seasons. Feeding the ducks and geese encourage them to keep returning to our beach and creating a mess by leaving their "droppings" everywhere. Not only is this unpleasant to look at and smells awful but it is also not healthy.
- We ask your help in not rocking the swim float as it can be easily damaged or set free. Also please do not stand or pull on the swim ropes. We want all our guests to be safe.
