

Warrant Articles

Article #1. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate One Million Nine Hundred and Eight Thousand Dollars (\$1,908,000) to replace the water distribution system including the well pump controls and water mains, and to authorize the issuance of not more than One Million, Five Hundred and Twenty-Six Thousand and Four Hundred Dollars (\$1,526,400) of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33) and to authorize the municipal officials to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon; and further to accept a grant from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) in the amount of Three Hundred and Eighty-One Thousand and Six Hundred Dollars (\$381,600). Commissioners recommend. Budget Committee recommends. (3/5) ballot vote required).
